

Note: Parent Set-up Needed

This is a great game to help kids practice their number recognition!

Materials You Will Need:

- a piece of larger paper like butcher paper or chart paper
- 10 plastic eggs
- permanent marker
- small pompom to be the "chick"

DIRECTIONS

1) Open up the plastic eggs and turn them all curved side up on a flat surface or large piece of paper.

2) Have an adult use a sharpie to write the numbers 1 - 20 on the tops of your egg halves.

3) Have the adult hide your "chick" under one of the eggs and give you clues about where it is hiding!

Finding this too hard or too easy for your child?

This can easily be adapted:

Tell them the number the chick is under. Give them clues about where the chick is instead. Your clues can vary in difficulty. *For example:*

- the chick is under the number that is 2 more than 5
- the chick is hiding under an even (or odd) number (or a multiple of 5, or 2, or 3....)
- the chick is under the number to the left of the 7
- have your child hide the chick and give you clues about where it is hiding.
- mix up the order of the eggs

Parent Connection:

Building your child's number sense promotes math confidence and flexible thinking. Number sense enables your child to see and talk about math as a language. This is essential to problem solving and building on your child's understanding for more complex math thinking. Playing a game with math makes learning fun and engaging and leads to better retention!

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
