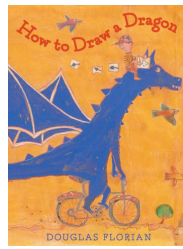




Knight Owl

by Jen Campbell

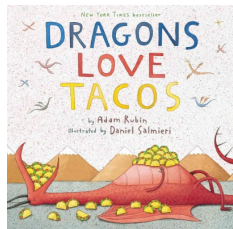

by Adam Rubin

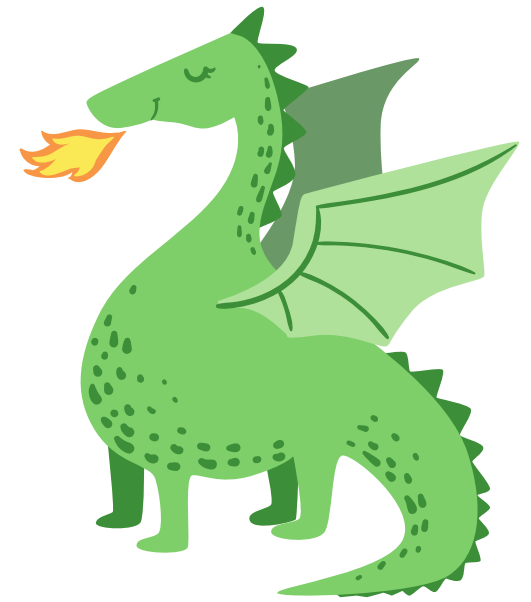
Explores the love dragons have for tacos, and the dangers of feeding them anything with spicy salsa.

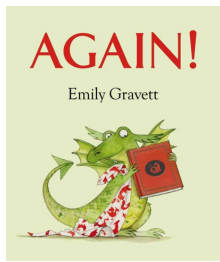

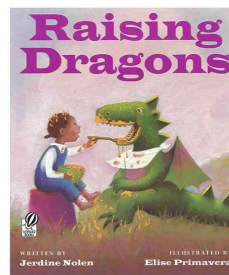
Sometimes it's hard to be good friends with dragons because they forget how. With some deep breaths and calming words, people and dragons can learn to be best friends forever.

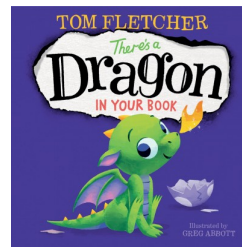
A bedtime book about a nonbinary child who uses the power of imagination to overcome sleep anxiety.

by Jerdine Nolen

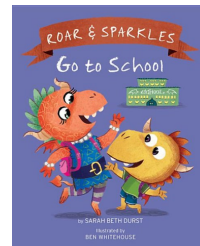
A farmer's young daughter shares numerous adventures with the dragon that she raises from infancy.

by Tom Fletcher

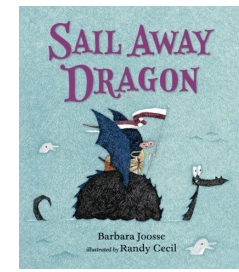
Oh look, there's an egg in your book! But this isn't any old egg, there's a dragon in it. Pretty soon she has set your book on fire, oh no!

by Sarah Beth Durst

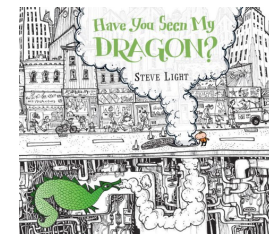
A sweet story about the anxieties children may feel about attending school for the first time, as well as a comforting tale about the bond between siblings.
