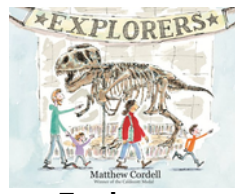




The Line in the Sand

A portrayal of war seen through the eyes of a young girl who finds hope in the symbolism of yellow butterflies against the background of a pure blue sky.

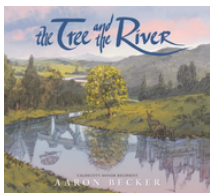


Over the Shop

by Celia Sacido

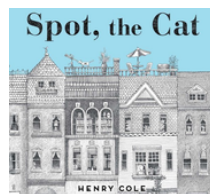
A man and his dog have a lovely surprise on their walk.

by Yoko Tanaka

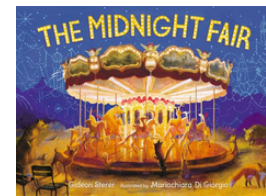
In a meadow filled with dandelion buds just about to flower, one dandelion blooms into a real lion. What a great, wide world there is to explore when you have paws instead of roots.

by Henry Cole

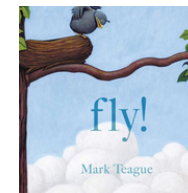
A cat named Spot ventures out an open window and through a city on a journey, while his owner tries to find him.

by Gideon Sterer

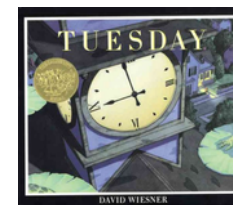
