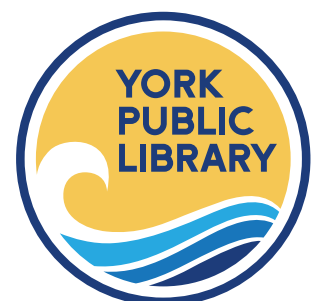

2024-2025



FROM OUR DIRECTOR

FY25 was an exciting and energizing year for the library, with 101,489 visitors coming through our doors—a 9% increase that pushed us past the 100,000 mark and underscored just how much this community values its library as a shared space.

Partnerships and civic life remained at the core of the library's impact. Collaborations with local organizations, including schools; nonprofits; town departments; and regional groups, expanded access to educational programming, social services, and community resources.

The library also served as an important gathering place, hosting hundreds of town and community meetings throughout the year and providing heavily used study and meeting room space. Programming overall continued to grow in both scale and scope, with nearly 600 programs drawing just under 20,000 attendees. The library offered a wide range of experiences, including technology classes, author talks, concerts, and interactive programs like our walking club and "Week in Review" discussions.

After-school programming and youth services remained a major draw, contributing to 5,700 participants over the year. New and ongoing offerings, from early childhood programs like "Little Explorers" to teen-centered initiatives and a summer reading program for all ages, reinforced the library's commitment to serving young people at every developmental stage and allowing kids and teens to learn, engage, and just be themselves.

Each fall brings a lecture funded by the Dan Bancroft Memorial Endowment for Civic Leadership and Engagement. The Endowment was established in memory of former Library Board President, Dan Bancroft. This year, we were honored to welcome a Pulitzer Prize winner—and Dan's favorite writer—Richard Russo.

Signature series, such as a community-wide wellness initiative and a climate change series, highlighted the library's ability to both convene partners and respond to timely topics. Art exhibits, a Juneteenth celebration, and our community read initiative further strengthened cultural engagement and community dialogue.



New initiatives like the seed library added a fun and sustainable way for people to engage, while grant funding helped us look ahead with projects like a new Digital Learning Lab. Even minus a full-time Head of Youth Services for most of the year, it was a year full of growth, creativity, and community connection.

The library experienced an uptick in giving this year. For the very first time, the results of our Annual Membership Campaign exceeded \$100,000, reflecting deep community investment in our mission.

Grant funding from the American Library Association supported the creation of the aforementioned Digital Learning Lab, and further supported the implementation of inclusive, technology-centered programs for kids. Thanks to YORKWISE, we were able to begin to give the Teen hangout room a badly-needed makeover.

Kennebunk Savings Bank underwrote our annual summer reading program. Altrusa of the Seacoast funded the purchase of children’s literacy materials; and as part of a wellness series, a grant from the York Rotary Club subsidized the purchase of books for a “Community Reads” initiative.

In the spring, we joined the community in collective shock over the sudden loss of Erin Fell, a young teen who was a huge library lover; indeed, she called it her “favorite place.” Erin also loved playing games and when memorial donations began flooding the library, soon followed by a generous gift from the Fell family, we began planning for a gaming space in a corner of the Children’s Room and an endowed fund to support tween activities. Stay tuned.

The Town of York generously allocated ARPA funding to install exterior security cameras around the building’s perimeter. The Police Department performed a Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) assessment (read: security audit) and the need for cameras were among the items they identified. Behind the scenes, key infrastructure improvements included the installation of a new, energy-efficient boiler. Since the library operates as a heating and cooling center during extreme weather, both the new boiler and security cameras ensure the building remains a safe and reliable space for patrons.

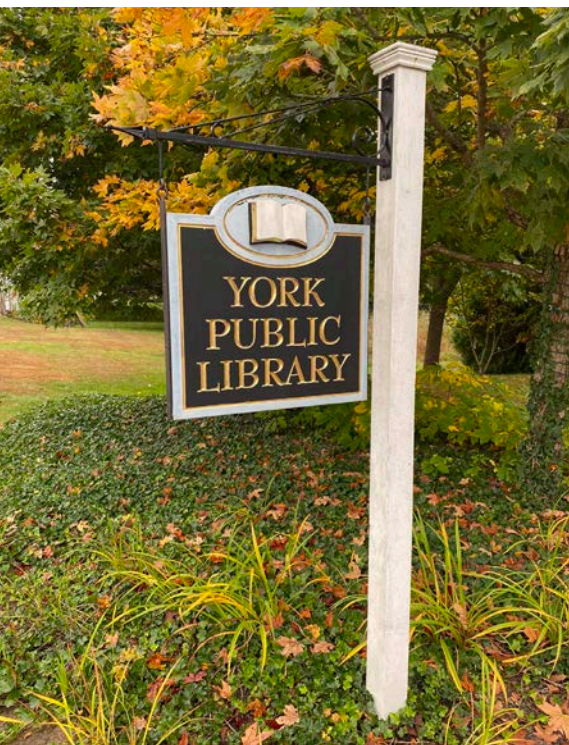
Over the course of the year, we also replaced all of the library’s wifi hotspots, and in the Community Room,

we replaced the LCD projector, AVR system, and for improved signal integrity, switched out our standard cables with commercial HDMI extenders.

This fiscal year was one of growth, connection, and real momentum for the library. From a record-breaking number of visits to creative programming for all ages, new initiatives, and facility improvements, the library continued to evolve as a welcoming, go-to space for the community. Support from donors, grant partners, and the Town made it possible to strengthen what we offer and look ahead to what’s next.

The library continues to be a place where people come together, even in challenging times. More than ever the library is a shared community space that residents of York care about, rely upon, and help sustain.

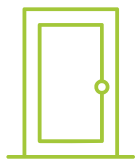

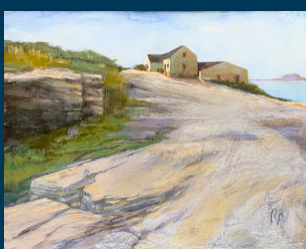

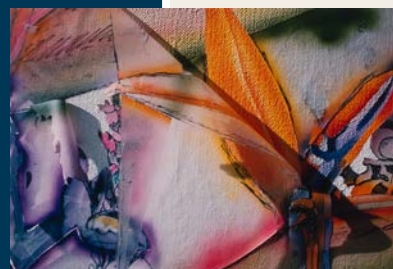

Children, Tweens, and Teens

What a year for our Youth Services team! Through engaging programming, outreach within the community, and the generous support of donors and grant funders, our team continued this year to positively impact the lives of so many children in our community.

This year, we welcomed Devon Bettinson as Assistant Librarian in the Children's Room. With some reshelving and reorganization, we created a dedicated tween space for games and gathering, while also adding a new regular program, *Little Movers*. The weekly program, launched in winter for crawling babies and toddlers, quickly became a favorite for developing gross motor skills and giving caregivers another opportunity to connect.

Programs for children and teens remained as vibrant as ever. Toddler and preschool storytimes with Miss Barb and Miss Katie continued to draw enthusiastic crowds for songs, stories, and connection. Children packed the Children's Room for activities ranging from fairy house building and scavenger hunts to "s'moreytimes."

Teen Librarian Danie Fortin offered creative and engaging programs for teens and tweens, including cookie decorating, backpack first aid kits, and drop-in crafting. Summer Reading Program kickoff events brought tremendous excitement, with 260 guests attending a Bluey party in the Children's Room and 50 teens joining a DIY ramen bowl event.

Community partnerships remained central to our mission. This year introduced *Pawsome Pen Pals* and *Canine Cuddles*, programs created in partnership with local therapy dogs and their handlers. Children could write letters to their favorite canine and they would receive letters back! Each month, the dogs visited the library for reading and cuddle time.

We were also proud to continue beloved collaborations throughout the community. York students in grades K-12 displayed their artwork throughout the library

in April in the Annual Student Art Show - which has become a much anticipated yearly exhibit showcasing the talent of York's youth. Miss Barb partnered with the York Land Trust for monthly storytimes and trail adventures. Together with the York Community Service Association (YCSA), we hosted another successful Halloween costume swap, helping ninety children and families find new-to-them costumes. Our Summer Reading Program finale, *Touch-a-Truck*, welcomed 202 attendees and featured support from the York Police Department, Fire Department, Department of Public Works, Casella, and Mr. Fox Composting.

Our young patrons also benefited from enriching educational partnerships. White Pine Programs and their AmeriCorps volunteers visited for four sessions focused on nature literacy, survival skills, fort building, crafts, and hands-on exploration with animal artifacts. Danie also presented at the New England Library Association Conference, sharing her expertise with library professionals across the region through a presentation on You(th) Mattering.

This work was strengthened by community support. Altrusa International of the Seacoast awarded two grants: one funding five Yoto audiobook players (screen-free!) and eighty accompanying story cards, and another supporting the creation of six new S.T.E.A.M. kits for our growing *Library of Things* collection. YORKWISE provided funding to begin refreshing the teen room, with new sound panels, shelving, storage, and flooring planned for fall 2025. In addition, funding from York Hospital allowed Danie to assemble and distribute 250 mental health kits for local high school students as part of Mental Health Awareness Month programming.

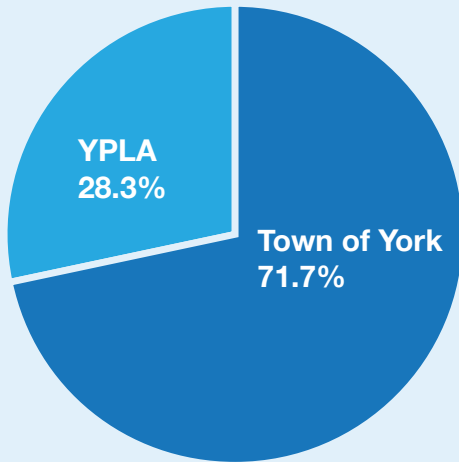
We are deeply grateful to the many community partners, grant funders, and supporters who help us create joyful, enriching experiences for the children and teens of York.

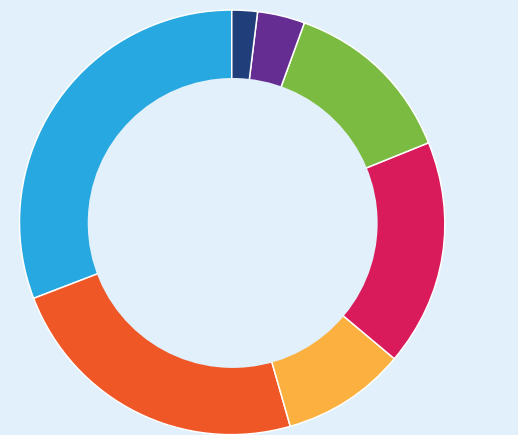

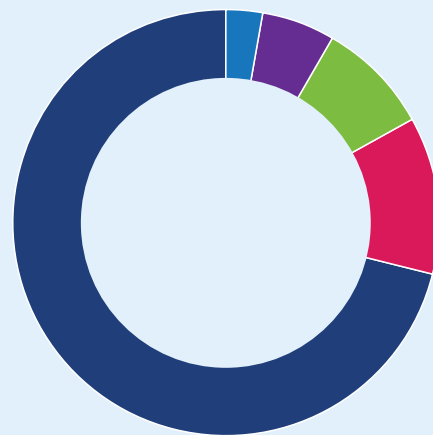

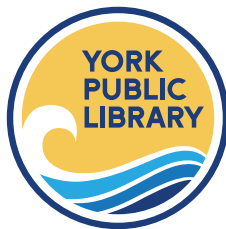
